Rupert Murdoch: No

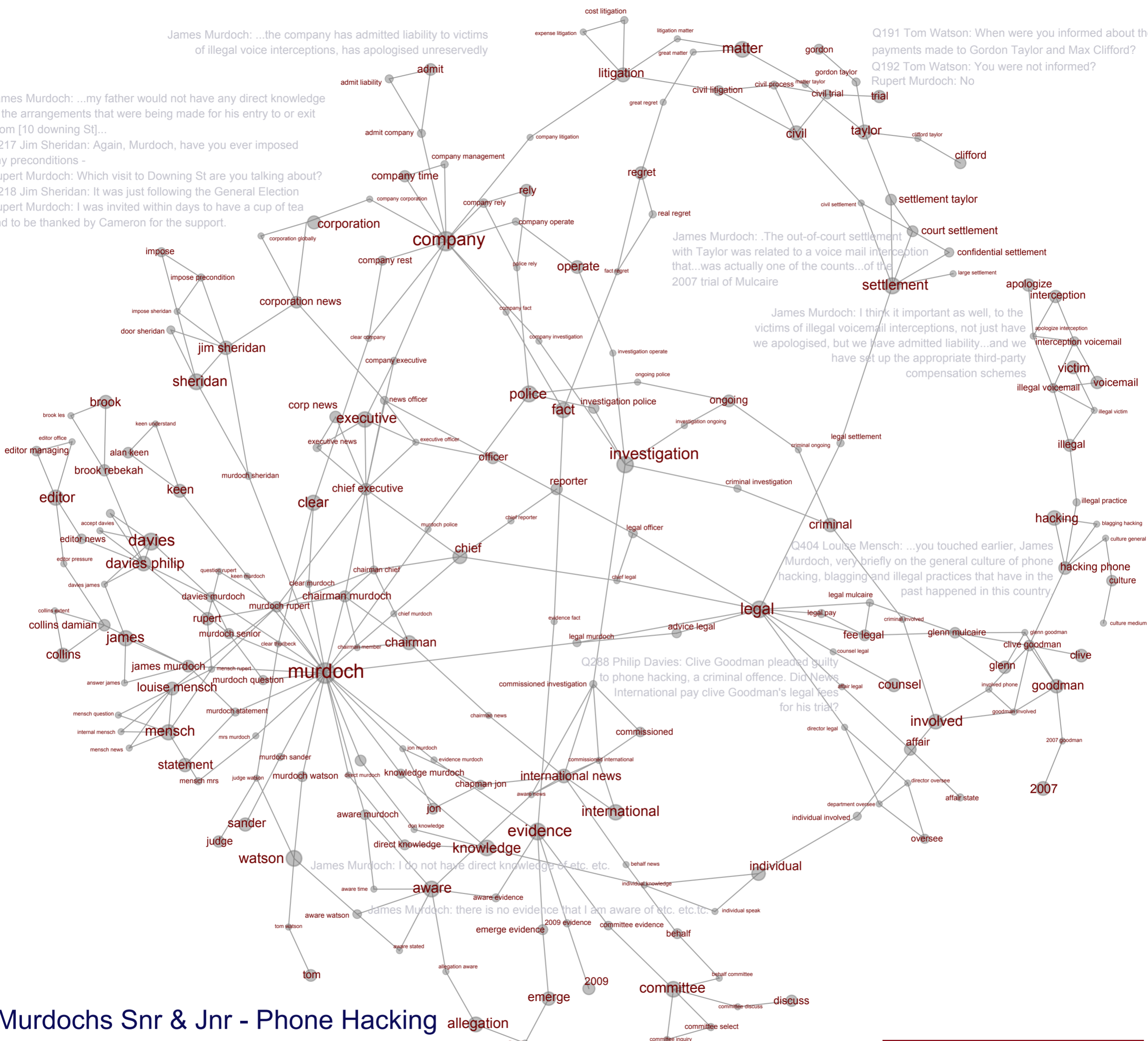
